Blood Thinners: Risk Factors

blood clot Anticoagulants are sometimes called blood thinners The most common places for blood clots to form are in your legs, your lungs, or your heart Blood clots can travel through your blood stream to other places in your body, such as your brain or heart A blood clot to your brain can cause a stroke, and a clot that blocks blood flow

blood is estimated to be, on average, 01% (1 in 1,000) The risk after exposure of non-intact skin to HIV-infected blood is estimated to be less than 01% A small amount of blood on intact skin probably poses no risk at all There have been no documented cases of HIV transmission due to an exposure involving a small amount of blood

A Student's Guide to Blood Donation

Sometimes it helps to think about something else to your attention from the blood being drawn You may also be told to try a simple te relax the muscles in your legs: Lift your legs (one at a time) off the donor bed After a whole blood donation, your body replaces the red blood cells (the cells that deliver oxygen to muscles and tissues)

Physiological Response to Fear in Expected and Unexpected ...

There was no difference in blood pressure between participants with or without the conditioned fear Fear is a subjective response What a person is afraid of and the degree of fear someone feels vary greatly from person to person This study showed that even those who are consciously not afraid of something still respond physiologically
